New Field and Laboratory Technician

Carryover and New Crop Testing

Now is the time to test your carry-over seed! It must be retested prior to any sales this fall. Many growers forget and find themselves with ineligible seed during the short sales season. Don't forget to send in a sample of any carryover seed and get the germination updated. Be sure to include the field name and lot number to assist in processing your samples as rapidly as possible. Samples of newly harvested small grains require an extra 5 days to break the dormancy. New crop samples will take essentially 14 days to test. Include the NCIA field name and tests needed. If you don't put that information on the sample, it will delay the testing process. Call the office and we will send you seed sample bags! Bags are free.

Field Cancellations

Only an applicant (not contract grower) may cancel a field or portion of a field. The applicant must contact the NCIA office before that time of inspection.

Affidavit vs Re-Inspection Required

If an affidavit is issued on your seed field, you will need to correct the problem, sign and date the affidavit, and send or scan and email it back to the NCIA office. If you receive an Re-Inspection Required, you will need to decide if you want to try to correct the problem and have it re-inspected at the cost of \$3.00 per acre. This is why it is important to check your field before the inspector arrives!

You may enter your field corrections into the Nebraska Seed Tracking System to expedite notification to the NCIA office. You will still need to send the signed form to the NCIA office. To enter the corrections follow these instructions:

Log into www.nciacert.org

- 1. Click on the Field Inspections tab
- 2. Click on the Fields Requiring Correction tab
- 3. Find the field that was corrected
- 4. Check the box indicating the field corrections have been made
- 5. Find the comment box and describe the corrections you made
- 6. Click the Save button

Wheat Variety Trial Field Tours

The plot is on the east side of Rd 425 (one mile north into Gosper County).
